Baruch atah הי Eloheinu Melech haolam asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu l'h-dlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, יה our G-d, Sovereign of the Universe, who has made us holy through commandments and commanded us to light Hanukkah candles.

ָבָּרוּדָ אַתָּה ה׳ אֶלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁעָשָה נִסִּים לַאֲבוֹותֵינוּ, בַּיָּמִים הָהֵם בַּוְמַן הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah הי Eloheinu Melech haolam she-asah nisim la'avoteinu bayamim hahaeim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, יח our G-d, Sovereign of the Universe, who performed miracles for our ancestors in those days in this time.

ַבָּרוּךָ אַתָּה ה׳ אֶלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךָ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁהֶחֱיָנוּ וְקִיְּמָנוּ וְהִגִּיעָנוּ לַזְּמַן הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah הי Eloheinu Melech haolam shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higianu laz'eman hazeh.

Blessed are You, יהי our G-d, Sovereign of the Universe, who gave us life, sustained us, and brought us to this time.

First light the Shamash, then kindle the remaining candles from left to right.

Facing the Hanukkah menorah, place candles in their holders from right to left.
