Ideas for Teachers

- To introduce the Torah portion *Tetzaveh*
- As part of a lesson on peer pressure

Enduring Understandings

- Torah can help provide guidelines for our daily lives.
- Our clothing can be a reflection of who we are and a way for us to show respect.

Possible Lesson Questions

- Why did Benjy's dad think he was dressed inappropriately for school?
- How doe what you wear to play baseball, swim at the beach, and go to school differ? Why do you wear different things to different places or on different occasions?
- What would you tell Benji about this Torah portion and how it relates to his choice of clothing for school?
- Does dress influence behavior?
- How do we know a mailman, a member of the navy, or a nurse by their dress?
 How are uniforms important to a person's job, to the people that work with that person, or to the community where a person works?
- How do friends influence the way we dress?
