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### **Passover Poem**

# **Direction Sheet: Leader**

The poem has all of the instructions they will need to find the answers to the riddle contained therein.

The answers to the riddle are as follows:

- i. 3 matzahs in total for the Seder plate
- ii. 2 times ritually washing hands during the Seder
- iii. 6 plagues directly related to animals: frogs, lice, wild animals, cattle disease, locusts, death of the first born
- iv. 3 items (matzah, maror, charoset) in the Hillel sandwich

Here are some helpful hints that can be offered as participants work through the poem:

- b) Think about the number of matzahs that are on the table. Specifically, think about how many there are if you count the afikoman along with the matzahs that were with it.
- c) There are times that the Haggadah instructs people to wash their hands. Look in the Haggadah to find those times.
- d) Remember that the killing of the first born included first-born animals.
- e) What food do we eat that is directly connected to Hillel? We do eat matzah as part of that food. What else do we eat with it?

#### Materials Needed:

- Four digit lock
- Copy of the Passover poem

#### Prepare in advance:

- If possible, after downloading, print the Passover Poem using a color printer as there is "watermark" on the page.
- Set the four-digit lock to 3263
