

Be the Sofer

כתב סת"ם (Ktav *STaM*) is the traditional Hebrew calligraphy style with which sacred texts are written. The word *STaM* is made up of the first letters of the texts this lettering is used to create: ספר תורה, תפילין, מזוזה (*Sefer Torah*, *Tefillin*, and *Mezuzah*). The predominant font used by a sofer, or scribe, is called *K'tav Ashuri*.

Here is what the Hebrew alphabet looks like when written in *K'Tav Ashuri*, the traditional *STA'M* font:
