

Make Your Sukkot Count Teacher's Guide

Gematria is a system in which Hebrew letters correspond to numbers. The basic system can be used to represent math with Hebrew letters. However, interpretive tradition has used gematria as a means to gain a deeper understanding of Biblical texts, and the world at large, through the numerical values associated with various words. Gematria is one of the interpretive principles of Midrash, and it is one of the important principles of the Kabbalists. Note that there are different systems of gematria. Some systems do assign values (500-900) to the חוֹפִיּנִי (final letters) of the Aleph-Bet. However, the basic system, which is being used here, assigns values to the Hebrew letters through n, "Tav."

To create other numbers, simply combine letters. For example:

יא = 11

25 = כה

183 = קפג

1478 = תתתרעח

Note: 15 and 16 are written 10 and 70 because yud-hei written together form one of God's names and yud-vov together look too much like part of God's four-letter name.

When reading Hebrew letters, the following groupings have the same value:

j / j

מ\ם

ב / כ / רְ / ך

בוב

שׁ\שׂ

צ / ץ

٩/٩/១/១

When writing gematria, use only the characters in the chart (no final letters or dots).
